Chairman's Annual Report

Another busy year has passed with a lot of hard work being done by Councillors and others to help make Chilton a great place to live in.

Chilton Field has figured prominently in previous vears' reports and the approaching development is now completion. Many of the new residents are getting involved in village activities. Bob Girling (a Chilton Field resident) has joined the Parish Council and is also taking a leading role in organising the Chilton Festival and D-Day Commemoration on Saturday 7 June 2014. More volunteers are needed to organise and participate in this event.

The new Community Room has been completed and handed over to the Parish Council. Final equipping is being carried out by the Village Hall Management Committee who will open it to hirers as soon as practicable.

The development has also enabled an upgrade and extension to the existing Village Hall via what is known as a Section

106 payment from the developers. The amount of work that has been done and is continuing to be done by volunteers to enhance the Village Hall and get the Community room into use cannot be over emphasised.

Another interesting project at Chilton Field is the Work Of Art. Volunteers from the village are part of a working group that is managing the project. The artist Tim Norris has now been commissioned for the artwork and consultation on its form is continuing.

Thames Water and problems sewerage were a feature of last year's report and perhaps inevitably problems started again this year in early January. Previously tankers were used to supplement the pumping station but the decision not to do so this year is possibly down to the limited effectiveness and the damage done to Dene Hollow. However as Thames Water did not appear to do anything to increase the capacity of the pumping station and/or prevent excess groundwater getting into the sewers the problem returned. We have not had a response from Thames Water on how and when they will fix the problem!

It appears that our Village may be subject to significant changes over the next few years. Work on the two additional north facing slip roads on the A34 is due to start in the summer and may in time act as a for further developments. However, of far greater impact and concern is the proposal in the Vale's Housing allocation to allow 1400 houses to be built on open fields adjoining the Village. The Parish Council and I believe most of the residents are strongly opposed to this inappropriate development. The Parish Council is submitting a forceful objection based on sound planning grounds. An excellent petition and survey has been circulated in the village which will show the Vale of White Horse District Council the extent of the objections and also demonstrate the weakness of their

arguments and that this is not just another NIMBY objection. However it is too early to say what the outcome will be so if you object continue to make your views known.

I know that many people value the Chronicle and it is their main source of information about what's happening in Chilton, but we do also have a website
